Thought of the Week:

'Watch this: God's eye is on those who respect him, the ones who are looking for his love. He's ready to come to their rescue in bad times; in lean times he keeps body and soul together.' Psalm 33:18-19 (The Message)

Is God's eye only on those who respect him, only on those looking for his love? Not at all! His eye is on us all.

However, when we respect him as Lord, and look for his unconditional love, we open our lives for him to rescue us, to keep body and soul together. But there is more. He wants to be involved in everything that happens in our lives. He is not just present to rescue us, or to keep body and soul together. We are inclined to divide life between those things which we think we can do ourselves, and those times when we feel we need God's help. That is not what God wants. God wants to journey with us not only when life gets a bit tough, but at all times. In the birth narratives Matthew's Gospel applies the name Immanuel, "God with us", to Jesus. (Matthew 1:23)

And remember Jesus words to the disciples just before he ascended into heaven, "I am with you always...." (Matthew 28:20)

When we allow our Lord to be involved in our everyday lives, we become confident that he will be there when life presents its challenges to us. Practising the presence of God in all that we do is a wonderful faith-builder.

One in six women and one in sixteen men have experienced violence at the hands of an intimate partner. On average one woman is killed by a partner every nine days and one man is killed every month. The Hills is no exception, domestic violence is endemic in all communities.

Members of The Hills community have a proud history of standing against domestic violence. Sadly, the recent pandemic caused the cancellation of the annual march held to highlight this blight in the community.

The march will return this year on Friday, 3 May, 2024.

The march is organised in conjunction with The Hills Area Command, Castle Hill RSL, Castle Towers and Soroptimists International of The Hills.

The march will leave Castle PI (adjacent to Castle Towers Purple Car Park) at 7.00 a.m. before proceeding down Castle St to Castle Hill RSL. Senior secondary students will complete their march at Castle Hill RSL.

Students will hear from speakers who will tailor their addresses to the "Love Bites" program being taught in Hills schools in collaboration with Castle Hill Police.

All other marchers, including your members, are invited to the Castle Hill Bowling Club for a breakfast provided by the Baulkham Hills Lions Club. You will then have an opportunity to hear from speakers who will speak about the strategies being put in place to reduce the incidence of domestic violence in our community.

We are inviting your organisation, yourself and your friends to join us to make a statement against domestic violence and seek effective ways to create change in our society.

If our society is to change, we all need to work together to make a difference.
