Thought of the Week:

There is a saying of Jesus on the Cross that makes me stand back in awe, and wonder again at God's love for each one of us.

'At noon, darkness fell across the whole land until three o'clock. At about three o'clock, Jesus called out with a loud voice,

"My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Matthew 27:45-46 (NLT)

What caused Jesus' feeling of abandonment? There is only one answer – sin! It is sin that separates us from God. The prophet Isaiah makes a very strong point to his people, '.....your iniquities have been barriers between you and your God, and your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he does not hear.' Isaiah 59:2 (NRSVUE)

But wait a moment, we know that Jesus, the Son of God, was without sin, sinless. So....why did he feel abandoned by God, separated from his Father?

Here is the most amazing answer. 'God made him who had no sin to be sin for us.....' 2 Corinthians 5:21 (NIV)

Jesus took upon himself our sin. He thus endured the consequences of our sin, feeling abandoned by his Father. He stood in our place, so that through him, we may be made right with God. He opened the way to heaven and to God for us.

During this Lenten season, stand before the Cross in awe of what God has done.



One in six women and one in sixteen men have experienced violence at the hands of an intimate partner. On average one woman is killed by a partner every nine days and one man is killed every month. The Hills is no exception, domestic violence is endemic in all communities.

Members of The Hills community have a proud history of standing against domestic violence. Sadly, the recent pandemic caused the cancellation of the annual march held to highlight this blight in the community.

The march will return this year on Friday, 3 May, 2024.

The march is organised in conjunction with The Hills Area Command, Castle Hill RSL, Castle Towers and Soroptimists International of The Hills.

The march will leave Castle PI (adjacent to Castle Towers Purple Car Park) at 7.00 a.m. before proceeding down Castle St to Castle Hill RSL. Senior secondary students will complete their march at Castle Hill RSL.

Students will hear from speakers who will tailor their addresses to the "Love Bites" program being taught in Hills schools in collaboration with Castle Hill Police.

All other marchers, including your members, are invited to the Castle Hill Bowling Club for a breakfast provided by the Baulkham Hills Lions Club. You will then have an opportunity to hear from speakers who will speak about the strategies being put in place to reduce the incidence of domestic violence in our community.

We are inviting your organisation, yourself and your friends to join us to make a statement against domestic violence and seek effective ways to create change in our society.

If our society is to change, we all need to work together to make a difference.
