**Thought of the Week**: 'After we had turned out the light a week or so ago I was quietly giving thanks to God when, in my spirit, I heard the words, "Are you really giving thanks?" After a very thoughtful moment I realised that I was only going through the motions of giving thanks — a kind of nightly ritual.

I had been reading from the prophet Isaiah, 'The Lord, the Lord himself, is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation.' Isaiah 12:2a-30 (NIV) Isaiah's words, "with joy", and "the Lord himself, is..... my song", suddenly resonated with me, and I realised that there was little joy in my giving thanks. I connected also to the words of Zephaniah, "He will take great delight in you; .......(he) will rejoice over you with singing." Zephaniah 3:17 (NIV)

As I lay there, contemplating those Scripture passages, the Lord's joy for me was fast becoming my companion, and I very briefly continued to give thanks, but with his joy in my heart.....and fell sleep. I learnt a lot from that. So often we learn things off by heart, and therein lies the trap. They can become so familiar that they lose their punch. Just going through the motions of giving thanks sometimes causes us to dwell on what is happening in our lives rather than on God, and that can lead to worry.

The joy of the Lord is my strength and song. Is it yours? So....how do we get in touch with that joy of the Lord?

Contemplating those Scriptures expressing God's joy for me, helped me. Yes, I felt it that night. What might help you? Quietly breaking out in song perhaps? Saying thanks is so important, but let our thanks give rise to joy, God's joy in our hearts and lives. Saying thanks will then take on a new dimension.

A week later Jesus was ordered crucified.


The little donkey so loved the Lord that he wanted to help Him carry the cross.
