Thought of the Week: 'Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad? I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again— my Saviour and my God!' Psalm 43:5 (NLT)

There are times when we disappoint ourselves because of what we say or do, and feel discouraged. However, recently I read that we need to tune out to other voices, particularly to those voices that might want to drag us down. I quote from an old writer whose words have had a great impact on me, "Never indulge, at the close of any action, in any self-reflective acts of any kind, whether of self-congratulation or of self-despair. Forget the things that are behind, the moment they are past, leaving them with God."

We need to tune out to those voices that may cause us to feel discouraged so that we can hear what the Lord is saying to us, for today and tomorrow. When we look at Jesus' life we see that he had to contend with other voices also. It began early in his ministry when he was confronted with the devil in the wilderness, but it happened again and again throughout his earthly ministry, particularly from the religious leaders, and sometimes from his disciples. Nothing, however, prevented him from his mission, even a Cross. Nothing got in the way of hearing his Father's voice, and being obedient to the will of his Father.

How do we tune out to those other voices - voices that are not of God? Indeed, how do we recognise the voices that are not of God? How did Jesus do it? He took time out and had some very intimate times with his Father on his own, without any distractions.

The psalmist's answer is simple, '*I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again— my Saviour and my God!*' Following the example of Jesus and getting away on our own, praising God, and having an intimate time with him is the road that we, too, must surely travel. And guess who travels that road with us – none other than Jesus himself. Easter tells us that.
