

Thought of the Week:

My heart has heard you say, "Come and talk with me." And my heart responds, "Lord, I am coming." **Psalm 27:8 (NLT)** We seem to be able to sail through some days, while there are other days when life is a bit of a struggle. When we are sailing through the day with the breeze at our backs, we feel that we have control of our lives; that we know what we are doing and where we are going. That, however, can be rather dangerous. In the good times, it is easy to leave God out of the equation when all the time he has been involved, but we didn't stop to notice. And, even worse, that can be the start of a habit; a kind of arrogant, "I'm OK". And you know the old saying that "pride comes before a fall".

On other days, when we seem to be swimming against the current we tend to quickly turn to God to sort things out. We hear him say, "Come and talk with me." It is then that we find ourselves virtually calling, "Lord, I am coming." If only we could do that at other times as well we might save ourselves from the inevitable fall. The Easter Jesus takes great delight in hearing from us in good times and bad. There is an old hymn that goes like this,

And he walks with me and he talks with me And he tells me I am his own And the joy we share as we tarry there None other has ever known.

When you have a moment please read, Luke 24:13ff.

Let's tarry with the risen Jesus no matter what life is dishing up to us. He will be delighted.

One in six women and one in sixteen men have experienced violence at the hands of an intimate partner. On average one woman is killed by a partner every nine days and one man is killed every month. The Hills is no exception, domestic violence is endemic in all communities.

Members of The Hills community have a proud history of standing against domestic violence. Sadly, the recent pandemic caused the cancellation of the annual march held to highlight this blight in the community.

The march will return this year on Friday, 3 May, 2024.

The march is organised in conjunction with The Hills Area Command, Castle Hill RSL, Castle Towers and Soroptimists International of The Hills.

The march will leave Castle PI (adjacent to Castle Towers Purple Car Park) at 7.00 a.m. before proceeding down Castle St to Castle Hill RSL.

Senior secondary students will complete their march at Castle Hill RSL. Students will hear from speakers who will tailor their addresses to the "Love Bites" program being taught in Hills schools in collaboration with Castle Hill Police.

All other marchers, including your members, are invited to the Castle Hill Bowling Club for a breakfast provided by the Baulkham Hills Lions Club. You will then have an opportunity to hear from speakers who will speak about the strategies being put in place to reduce the incidence of domestic violence in our community.

We are inviting your organisation, yourself and your friends to join us to make a statement against domestic violence and seek effective ways to create change in our society.

If our society is to change, we all need to work together to make a difference.
