Thought of the Week:

"Sow a thought and you reap an action; sow an act and you reap a habit; sow a habit and you reap a character; sow a character and you reap a destiny." - Ralph Waldo Emerson

This quotation raises lots of issues. How important are our thoughts? Just where can they lead? Look at this Bible passage, '....letting your sinful nature control your mind leads to death. But letting the Spirit control your mind leads to life and peace.' Romans 8:6 (NLT)

The apostle Paul makes the point that control of our minds can be a matter of life and death. That makes me shudder, but it really shouldn't. Just how do we control our minds and thus our thoughts? A little later in his letter to the church in Rome we find Paul writing,

'Don't copy the behaviour and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think.' Romans 12:2 (NLT)


We are all influenced by the behaviour and customs of this world, and that influence can affect our thoughts and our thinking. The important thing is to recognise that that is happening as it happens, and immediately seek the forgiveness of God. Then we accept his forgiveness, and don't dwell on it any further. We leave it with him instead of chastising ourselves for what we consider to be thoughts that are not of God.

This may be something that we need to work at, to practice. But we are not on our own here. We have an Advocate. Our defense against such thoughts is living in the Spirit. '....letting the Spirit control your mind leads to life and peace.' I hardly need to say how important is our personal devotional life. The closer we live with God the more the Spirit is going to let us know when our thoughts and thinking are not of God.

One of the most important days on the Australian calendar is Anzac Day, which is celebrated annually on April 25. It is a significant occasion across Australia and New Zealand, with the day being a public holiday on both sides of the Tasman Sea.

This date is the anniversary of the day Australian and New Zealand soldiers landed on the beaches of Gallipoli in 1915 as part of the Allies' invasion.

We recognise more than 1.5 million men and women who have served Australia in all conflicts, wars and peacekeeping operations.

Every week in Australia a person is killed by their partner or a former partner. Many more are subjected to abuse and violence.

Enough is Enough!

Domestic and family violence is no longer a private matter. It is a whole of community problem and together we can work towards ending domestic and family violence in our community. As part of Domestic Violence Awareness in May, we will march for change and a call for an end to domestic and gender-based violence in the Hills.

The march will begin at Castle Place, Castle Hill (outside Castle Towers Carpark) at 7am and will finish at Castle Hill Bowling Club. The march will conclude with breakfast and speakers bringing us up-to-date on incidence of DV and strategies developed to reduce its occurrence.

The breakfast BBQ is free but ask that you consider making a gold coin donation to the Hills Domestic Violence Prevention Network to support the incredible work they do in our community.

Grab your friends, your family and your workmates and join us in working towards eradicating domestic and family violence in our community.

May our unity in Christ shine brightly, dispelling the darkness of division and discord. Together, as one body, let us work towards a world where love triumphs over hatred, and where justice and peace reign.

We want to let you know the second Uniting Climate Action Network conference is coming up on Saturday May 11. *The Faith in a Better Future Conference* will illuminate ways we as a faith community can address the challenge of global warming and help build the better, safer future we long for. Concern for climate action, as the conference title suggests, arises from our Christian faith. The Uniting Church has been committed to environmental action since its inception. Our church believes God is the Creator of this world and all its life and that these are inherently "good". More than that, our church understands that God's ultimate purpose for the world is renewal and transformation, not destruction by human beings. Those convictions led to the creation of the Synod Climate Action Strategy in 2019, which has evolved into the Stewardship of the Earth focus of the Synod's Future Directions. What will this conference be about? We know the problems, and that's important, but just staying with the problems can be overwhelming. And, by itself, it doesn't change anything.

So, this conference will inform, but it will have a focus on solutions – the steps that will improve the situation, and action - what we can do to ensure those steps happen, and quickly enough.
