**Thought of the Week**: Near the end of his life the Apostle John recorded a vision, that had been revealed to him by Jesus Christ, for the seven churches in Asia. One of those churches, the Church in Ephesus was commended for much that the Church had done.

*"I have seen your hard work and your patient endurance."* **Revelation 2:2 (NLT)** But then there came a message that must have been like a virtual bombshell to them, *"You don't love me or each other as you did at first!"* **Revelation 2:4 (NLT)** 

What had gone wrong? Who or what had become their first love? Many of us do a lot for the Church, but why do we do it? For our own gratification, or to impress others, or.....? From time to time it is a good idea to pause and question our motives for whatever we are doing. Dr. Sangster, one of England's great preachers some years ago, wrote a number of books, and I recall reading (in essence), "When I get to the office each day I see all the work that I have to do, but I know that I must ignore all that, and spend time with my Lord." Why did he do that? Our time with God enables the Spirit to move in our lives, and guide us as to what the priorities are, in what may be a busy schedule for that day. And this applies not only to the Dr. Sangsters of our world but to us all whether we work in an office, on a building site, in the home, or even retired. If only we would stop first scrutinising our checklists, and begin by focusing our attention on the presence of Jesus how much more might we get done? Just who or what is our first love?

But notice something else in this word of our Lord to the Church at Ephesus, "You don't love me <u>or each other</u> as you did at first." When our Lord Jesus Christ is our first love we are enabled to love each other in the best and highest way, without any strings attached, without wanting anything back. When our Lord is not our first love we hurt him, ourselves, and perhaps others. Let's pause a moment, and hear what the Spirit may be saying to us.

#### "Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God." 1 John 5:1-6

The lectionary sets out the epistle of 1 John 5:1-6 as one of this week's readings, and as we immerse ourselves in the words we see very quickly a rich tapestry of faith, love, and triumph woven by the beloved disciple.
